CHAMPAGNE

The name Champagne and the method (La Méthode Champenoise) both are protected by law in all EU countries, Australia, New Zealand and most other countries. It is the only AOC wine in France which does not have to display 'appellation contrôlée' on the label. The word Champagne is sufficient. The discovery of Champagne is the result of an accident. It all began when the wine growers from the Champagne region were trying to equal the Burgundy wines. However, they did not succeed due to the cold winters in the region that caused the fermentation of the wine which were lying in the cellars, to stop. The cold climate ensured that the sleeping yeast cells awoke again in spring and started fermenting causing the release of carbon dioxide gas, which was coming from the wine in the bottle. At first, the bottles were weak and exploded but the ones that survived contained the sparkling wine.

SPARKLING WINE

Sparkling wines production starts from a still wine that undergoes to a secondary fermentation. This step, also known with the French term prise de mousse, occurs after the addition of the liqueur de tirage, a mix of yeasts, sucrose nutrient, and adjuvants. Depending on the used technology, this secondary fermentation can occur inside the same bottle that reaches the consumer (traditional method) or in a pressurized tank (Charmat method).

WHITE WINE SELECTION

ALBARIÑO

Albariño is one of the liveliest white wines in Europe and considered one of the best wines for seafood, Albariño comes from the region of Rias Baixas along the north-western coast of Galicia. Albariño is a delightful combination of high acidity, an ethereal salinity, citrus flavours and a long dry finish. The granite soils of Rias Baixas can be picked up in the aromas, giving minerality to the wine, along with fresh lime and nectarine on the nose.

CHENIN BLANC

Chenin Blanc is an incredibly multifaceted grape used to make white wine of varying styles, be it clean and crisp, oak aged, sweet or even sparkling. Chenin Blanc is generally a very fresh, clean and nutty variety, often exhibiting apple and pear flavours and offering up hints of honey as well.

CORTESE

Cortese is a white Italian wine grape variety predominately grown in the south-eastern regions of Piedmont in the provinces of Alessandria and Asti. One of the earliest documentation of the Cortese grape dates back to a 1659 report to the Marchesa Doria from the estate manager of the family's villa in Montaldeo states that all the vineyards were planted with Cortese and Vermentino. Cortese wine has an aromatic slightly acidic bite. Light straw yellow colour, with typical green hues, it is a dry, fresh and harmonic wine. It is fruity, fragrant, with a persistent, complex bouquet with scents of banana, apricot and fresh hay.

ÇALKARASI

Çalkarasi variety is native to Çal – Denizli. Grown in a single vineyard at an altitude of 950 meters, the grapes are pressed in whole clusters and removed from the skins immediately to produce a white wine of darker colour grapes. The juice is then fermented in stainless steel tanks at a temperature of 18C and aged on its lees for 3 months to provide complexity. The nose has lovely aromas of red fruits. The palate is well balanced with good acidity and bright fruit.

CHARDONNAY

To any wine idolizer, it comes as no surprise that, for several decades Chardonnay has been one of the most successful white wines in the world. This green-skinned grape is used to make a vast array of white and sparkling wines, ranging from the exquisitely crisp and mineral wines of Chablis to the tropical flavours of warm climate wines from areas such as Napa Valley. Chardonnay and characteristics are very regionally dependent. Cooler region wines, such as those from France, exhibit crisp green apple, citrus and pear flavours. Warmer climate wines have more prominent stone fruit notes of peach, whilst the warmest regions can produce tropical notes of mango and banana. Oak ageing adds butter and vanilla notes.

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GEWÜRZTRAMINER

Gewürztraminer is most commonly found in the Alsace region of France, where it's believed to have originated, and is the second most planted grape variety in the region today. More than almost any other wine we might regularly encounter, Gewürztraminer is particularly distinctive. The explosive aromas of rose, lychee, gingerbread, orange marmalade and grapefruit comes vaulting out of the glass.

GRÜNER VELTLINER

Couple of decades back Grüner Veltliner failed to list its name in top 25 grape varieties. But today it is recorded as a testament in surging success of Austrian wine. Grüner Veltliner by far is the most important white wine variety in Austria, which comes from crossing of Traminer and a centuries-old vine St. Georgen. The primary fruit flavors in Grüner Veltliner are lime, lemon and grapefruit. There is also a green and herbaceous flavor that is often described as white pepper. However, what makes Grüner Veltliner wine so unique is its signature vein of acidity

PINOT GRIGIO

Pinot Grigio is the grey member of the pinot family, aptly named due to the dusty greyish skin of the grapes. While it's widely grown in Italy, particularly in the North East regions of Lombardy, the Veneto and Friuli, the grape itself actually originates from France where it's known as Pinot Gris. Pinot Grigio and Pinot Gris are the exact same grape, produced in a distinctly different style. The Pinot Grigio we are all accustomed to tends to exhibit white peach notes, slight citrus tings and a hint of pear. An element of perfume and light spice round off what is a light, easy-sipping white

RIESLING

Riesling is considered by many wine aficionados to be the most noble and unique white grape variety in the world. The grape is thought to be originated in the Rhiengau region of Germany, probably as one of the offspring of Gouais Blanc and an unknown father. This aromatic wine offers primary fruit aromas of orchard fruits like nectarine, apricot, honey-crisp apple, and pear. Besides fruit, you'll often smell things like honeycomb, jasmine, or lime peel, along with a striking aroma that smells similar to petrol or petroleum wax

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SAUVIGNON BLANC

Whilst many see New Zealand as being the most synonymous with Sauvignon Blanc, its historical homeland is in fact France where it was the leading force behind early world-beating dry white wine styles. The name Sauvignon comes from the French word Sauvage, meaning wild. It is fitting name for a vine that, if left to its own devices, would grow with riotous abandon. Riotous, untamed and wild also perfectly describes its flavours. Straw, hay, grass, smoke, green tea, green herbs, lime and gunflint charge in around your palate with remarkable intensity.

TORRONTÉS

Torrontés is an aromatic white wine that originated in Argentina. Torrontés is an ideal wine to match with Asian and Indian cuisine due to its sweet floral aromas of rose petals and flavors of white peach and lemon zest. The wine smells sweet, but is usually made in a dry style and the best Torrontés wines come from the high elevation vineyards in Salta, Argentina.

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VERDEJO

Verdejo is a relatively uncommon grape variety grown almost exclusively in Spain. The refreshing style of Verdejo also comes with a swath of subtly complex fruit flavours. Big hints of citrus are particularly prevalent, with notes of lime and grapefruit leading the way.

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THE ROSÉ FROM THE WATER

Wine is sunlight held together by water

ROSÉ WINE

Rosé gets its colour from the juices' contact with the skin of the grapes. And almost any red wine grape will do, the most popular including grenache, Sangiovese, Shiraz, Mourvèdre, Carignan, Cinsaut and pinot noir. As the red grape skins and juice soak together for a few hours to a few days, the colour bleeds into the juice (free-run), giving wine its characteristic red, white, pink or even orange colour – a process known as maceration. As soon as the juice begins to take on the desired pink colour, the skins are removed and the juice ferments, creating the delicious rosé we all know and love. Centuries ago, winemakers produced wines that were much lighter in colour and body due to shorter maceration times, so they would have been consistently pale pink.

RED WINE SELECTION

BARBERA

Barbera is the most widely planted red grape in the North-western Italian region of Piedmont, upswung to prominence there after the Phylloxera infestation. Laden with red fruit and high levels of acidity but with low tannins, this is a very satisfying medium bodied red. As Barbera is typically enjoyed young, the effects of oak ageing are sometimes limited. Common notes are therefore largely fruit-led, with flavours of blackberry, dark cherry and strawberry typically found.

CABERNET SAUVIGNON & CABERNET BLENDS

The preeminent classic grape variety is capable of making some of the most structured, complex, majestic and age worthy reds in the world. It is astounding that a wine so often angular and powerful when young can metamorphose into a velvety, rich, elegant and complex wine with several years of ageing. Heard of the term Claret? This refers to the great and sophisticated red wines from Bordeaux, often made with Cabernet Sauvignon, or Merlot, or both together. Intense and unctuous black fruit flavours of blackcurrant, blackberries and cherry. If you love a fruit explosion with your wines, then you'll absolutely love this variety. With age, Cabernet Sauvignon develops prominent savoury notes including cedar, tobacco, chocolate, mint and eucalyptus.

CARMÉNÈRE

An ancient Bordeaux variety (also known in Bordeaux as *grande vidure*) whose parents are Cabernet franc and Gros Cabernet. The grape is virtually extinct in Bordeaux today, it is flourishing in Chile, where it is considered as the leading red and can make complex, intensely red-hued wines. It is said that the name Carménère is derived from Latin word Carmin meaning Crimson. Carménère wines boast a plethora of red and black fruit notes, spice, smokiness and herbal notes. Distinct flavours of Carménère include green bell pepper, tobacco and leather, and don't be surprised if you detect a touch of dark chocolate.

CINSAULT

Cinsault, or Cinsaut, is a red grape variety classically found in southern Rhône blends and Provençal rosé. The grape often blended with Grenache as one of the eighteen permitted partner in the famous Châteauneuf-du-Pape region. Cinsault is known for its spicy, fruity, smoky flavours, with ripe strawberry, cherry and dried fruit notes. Expect spicy notes of black pepper and clove, along with floral notes of violet. It is naturally low in tannin and acidity, with a soft perfume or aromatic quality

CORVINA

Considered as the most important red grape in the blends that makes one of the most prestigious Italian red wine Amarone della Valpolicella, in Veneto region. It probably originated in the area around Verona. One of its parents is Refosco dal peduncolo rosso. The word Corvina is said to be derived from the word corvo — meaning crow (referring to the colour of the grape). The grape is usually blended with its sisters Progeny, Rondinella and Molinara. Notes of sour cherry are balanced by sweet red fruit flavours such as strawberry and plum. The thick skins of these grapes make them perfect for drying and therefore can commonly be used in Amarone wines where flavours are richer and more concentrated.

GRENACHE & GRENACHE BLEND

Although originating in Spain where it's known as Garnacha. The red Grenache noir is especially valued and makes a slew of stunning wines around the world. Grenache is the leading grape variety in many Southern French wines including, Châteauneuf-du-Pape, Côtes — du — Rhône and Grenache is typically medium bodied, usually with higher alcohol content than most red wines. With a quality bottle of Grenache, you're going to experience a lovely flavour profile of juicy red fruits backed with spice notes of cinnamon and white pepper. When aged, savoury notes of leather come to the fore, with subtle hints of herbs, particularly in Old World countries.

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MALBEC

Indigenous to south-western France was popular with its original name Cot, is the offspring two obscure French grapes Magdeleine Noire des Charentes and Prunelard. While Malbec is one of the five main red grapes that can be blended to make eminent Bordeaux blend. The plantings of Cot significantly declined today. Malbec makes up to barely 10% of Bordeaux wines. Half a world away, however, Malbec is a star. In the mid — nineteenth century, the grape was brought from Bordeaux to Argentina, where it is now the leading grape for the finest Argentinian reds. Malbec is famed for its dark fruit flavours and long finish. New World Malbec is heavier in bramble fruit flavours, and is generally noticeably more fruit-driven due to being grown in a warmer climate. You may also detect subtly sweet notes of vanilla, chocolate and liquorice

MERLOT

Very similar in flavour and texture to Cabernet Sauvignon. Both grape shares a common father Cabernet Franc. But Merlot mother is Magdeleine Noire des Charentes, while Cabernet's mother is Sauvignon Blanc. In the regional French dialect, the name Merlot means "little black bird" (Named after the blackbird merlau who reportedly loves to eat grapes). Depending on the style of Merlot, the taste profile can be quite different. Flavours commonly associated with Merlot include plum, blackberries, cherries and red fruits. Alternatively, you may experience the sensation of tucking into a delicious fruit-cake with chocolatey notes. Barrel-aged Merlot, you'll find, starts to develop sweet spice notes of vanilla and clove along with a wonderful velvety texture.

NEBBIOLO

One of the oldest and most valued varieties of Piedmont., nebiolo was first mentioned in Piedmontese documents in the early thirteenth century. Its parents are presumed extinct, but its origin does appear to be either Piedmont or perhaps the Valtellina region of Lombardy. Massively structured and adamantly tannic when young. The finest Nebbiolos, however possess a combination of complexity and power. On the nose these wines have a very light, floral aroma to them, commonly misleading people into expecting a very light, delicate red. However, when tasting wines from this grape you will be hit with a wave of bright fruit flavours of red cherry and raspberry, creating a real excitement on the palate. Secondary flavours of leather and star anise also come through adding a complexity to this wine.

PINOT NOIR

Thought to be more than two thousand years old, Pinot Noir is considered as one of the 'founder varieties'. Pinot Noir is the great grandparent of scores of other well – known grapes, from Gamay to Corvina and Garganega. It is also, according to geneticist Dr. José Vouillamoz, Pinot Noir is likely to be the grandparent of Syrah. While the parents and exact origin of Pinot Noir itself is not known, the name is generally thought to be derived from the word pin, meaning pine, because of its small clusters resemble a pine cone. Pinot Noir exhibits smooth red fruit flavours of strawberry, raspberry and cherry with an earthy, smoky edge.

PINOTAGE

Indigenous to South Africa Pinotage is the man made creation and labour of love, as opposed to having evolved naturally. Pinotage was developed almost a century ago by Stellenbosch University's first Professor of Viticulture, Abraham Izak Perold. Pinotage is packed full of black fruit flavours, although younger wines can showcase a lovely red berry hint. Older vines produce vino that's incredibly rich, spicy and savoury in flavour, resulting in complex flavours of tobacco, smoke, leather and lashings of liquorice. The earthiness comes through on the nose, while dark berry flavours come to life on the palate.

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SANGIOVESE

Italy's most famous grape, Sangiovese is responsible for three great wines of Tuscany. Chianti Classico, Vino nobile di Montepuciano, and Brunello di Montalcino. Sangiovese is a dark grape varietal known for high yields, slow ripening and being notoriously difficult to work with. Sangiovese produces wines with more savoury and earthy flavours than most other reds. You'll experience notable aromas of cherry and fig, followed by a flavour profile of sour cherry, cranberry and red plum, with subtle notes of roasted pepper. Light oakling of Sangiovese is increasingly popular and leads to richer, plum-mier flavours, as well as hints of coffee, leather, spice and smoky nuances.

SUPER TUSCAN

While not an 'official' category of wines, the Super Tuscans are well known and highly regarded style of Tuscan wine. The term Super Tuscan originated in the 1970s as a result of the Chianti DOC regulations in place at that time, which required that Chianti be made from Sangiovese blended with several other indigenous grape varieties including a small percentage of wine grapes. Winemakers began to question the formula, believing that the required blend of grapes was limiting the quality potential of their wine. Some producers wanted to stop using the white grapes in the blend, others felt the wine should be 100% Sangiovese. While some wanted international varieties to be included. Super Tuscans are typically rich in Sweet plums and cherries notes succeeded by subtle hits of tobacco and oak spice, and a long rich finish.

SHIRAZ / SYRAH

Shiraz is one of the most popular black grape varieties in the world. It's also known as Syrah in Old World wine regions, with Northern Rhône in France being the classic region for internationally renowned premium-quality Syrah. When it comes to New World Shiraz, the Barossa Valley in South Australia holds the title for oldest Shiraz vines in existence, producing high quality wines with very rich, concentrated dark fruit and oak flavours, along with a high alcohol content.

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TEMPRANILLO

Tempranillo is a very old, thick skinned grape variety with deep colour. It's the fourth most planted grape variety in the world and the most widely planted red variety in its native Spain. In fact, the name Tempranillo actually comes from the Spanish word temprano, meaning "early", in reference to the early ripening of the grapes in comparison to other varietals. Tempranillo wines tend to be quite complex with many layers of flavour. You'll generally find it delivers significant red fruit flavours of cherry, strawberry and raspberry, along with a hint of fig. Notes of tobacco, leather, cedar and spice are also present and become particularly prominent when the wine is aged in oak barrels.

ZINFANDEL

American varietal, the origins of Zinfandel are believed to lie in Croatia, where it's known as "Tribidrag" or Crljenak Kaštelanski. Tribidrag travelled from Croatia to Italy in the 18th century, where its early-ripening nature earned it the name Primitivo. The grape then travelled from Italy to America in the 19th century. Fruit dominate Zinfandel wines, so you'll often taste blackberry, blackcurrant, raspberry and cherry flavours. You may also experience notes of aniseed, smoke and black pepper. Over in the states, Zinfandel is often matured in American oak barrels, giving the wine wonderful hints of vanilla and tobacco.

There is no simple definition of a dessert wine. Dessert wines are sweet wines typically served with dessert, such as Sauternes, Constantia, Vin Santo, Tokaji Aszú, Eiswein or Ice wine, Trockenbeerenauslese, Beerenauslese or Recioto della Valpolicella. Despite the name they are often best appreciated alone or with fruit or bakery sweets.

COPENHAGEN SPARKLING TEA SELECTIONS

Sparkling Tea was developed by the award-winning sommelier Jacob Kocemba, during his time at a Michelin restaurant in Copenhagen, Denmark. He realized the many possibilities within the world of tea, when he couldn't find a matching wine for a dessert, despite a wine cellar of more than 1,700 wines. Instead, the solution came in a homemade tea extract, which consisted of a blend of different exclusive teas.

NON ALCOHOLIC SPARKLING TEA

Copenhagen Sparkling Tea BLÅ 115

BLÅ starts out with delicate aromas of jasmine, chamomile and a hint of citrus. This is followed by a round taste from the careful selection of white teas and accompanied by good complexity and depth from the green teas. It ends in a long finish joined by comfortable tannins created by the Darjeeling First Flush.

Copenhagen Sparkling Tea LYSERØD 120

A complex and comfortably dry taste follows, thanks to the Oolong tea, combined with hints of blackberries and hibiscus. It's all balanced by the smooth Silver Needle white tea and finished with light bitter fruity notes.

LOW ALCOHOL SPARKLING TEA

Copenhagen Sparkling Tea GRØN (ABV 5% v/v) 130

GRØN has clear aromas of lemongrass and citrus. The fresh characteristics are also significant in the taste, where they are joined by notes of green apples and a hint of ginger. This creates a mineral and crisp experience, which ends in a balanced bittersweet finish

Copenhagen Sparkling Tea RØD (ABV 5% v/v) 130

RØD has immediate notes of red berries, hibiscus, blackberries and a balanced citrus. This is followed by a light bitterness from the bergamot oil found in our Lady Grey and Earl Grey teas. The finish is semi-dry, which harmonizes beautifully with the initial berry notes. The colour is light pink with shades of orange

Copenhagen Sparkling Tea VINTER (ABV 5% v/v) 135

The complex flavours of VINTER is a unique combination of warm aromas of cinnamon, cardamom, clove and raisins as a result of the Chai tea. These spicy characteristics are also found in the taste, where they are joined by discrete notes of bergamot oil from the Earl Grey tea. This results in a smooth, elegant and round experience, with an intense finish, and balanced by hints of citrus
